



WAS WIR SÄEN ist eine Young Adult-Dystopie, die existentielle Themen unserer Zeit verbindet: Die Folgen des Klimawandels, politische Umbrüche und soziale Ungerechtigkeit.

Die jungen Protagonistinnen müssen sich allein durchschlagen und entscheiden, welchen Werten sie folgen. Vordergründig kämpfen sie um Nahrungsmittel, doch suchen sie auch einen Weg aus ihrer Einsamkeit. Juni und Alev lernen, die Welt mit den Augen der vermeintlichen Gegnerin zu betrachten und, dass sie einander brauchen, um etwas zu verändern.
